The Four-legged Farmhand:

New TO THE PACK

t's hard to live on a farm and have only one dog. Yet introducing another canine to the family pack can be tricky, depending on the dogs' personalities.

Dog trainers recommend a number of approaches when bringing a new dog into a family with other resident dogs:

Spay or neuter. Before you introduce two dogs, make sure both are spayed or neutered and have had at least one month since the surgery to let most of the hormones leave their systems. Dogs with raging reproductive hormones are less likely to keep the peace.

Choose the opposite sex. Although it's not a hard and fast rule, dogs of the opposite sex generally get along better with each other. If your resident dog is a female, consider making your new dog a male, and vice versa.

Introduce on neutral territory. It's never a good idea to bring a new dog into an established



dog's territory without first making proper introductions. Take both dogs to a neutral place where neither has been, and let them meet under these circumstances. Do this a couple of times

> before you bring the new dog home. Your established dog will be more welcoming of the newcomer if they've already met somewhere else.

Make it good. When the dogs are meeting each other for the first time, talk to them in a happy voice and limit their sniffing of each other to one minute at a time. Get their attention and tell them to sit or to do another command, and then offer each animal considerable praise. This helps the dogs develop a positive impression of each other.
